### 8. **A Brief Description of the School Activities.**

- a. **Horticulture:** Nature showers its bounties in plenty. Plants are the most precious gifts nature has endowed us with. Tending and nurturing of the plants is one of the best life skills, a child can acquire along with academics. With its plan to develop three new plots of medicinal, cactus and ornamental plants during the session 2009 -10, the school has expanded its botanical hub in a very big way. These plants and flowers not only lend charm to the campus but also enrich the knowledge of the children about the botanical world. Around fifty saplings have been planted in and around the school campus and Rawatbhata locality during the session.
- b. **School Library:** A library is a repository of knowledge and information. It is an integral part of any educational institute that shapes the future of the students. As it is one of the yardsticks of assessing the quality of an educational institution, there has always been a meticulous effort from the management side to upgrade our library services. The school library is already a treasure of 14600 books of varied tastes. The masterpieces of prominent authors, autobiographies and biographies of great personalities are the real gems that our library preserves. In order to augment knowledge and create flair for reading among students certain positive measures such as Best Reader Awards, Periodic Quiz Contests, Book Week etc have been initiated. The career guidance section of the library renders an invaluable assistance to those students who are sooner than later going to face the real challenges of life. 550 new volumes have been added to the library collection in the academic session 2009-10. The school library also receives 8 news papers daily and 51 magazines of different nature. About 100 to 150 students access the library facility daily during and after the school

hours. The library complex has recently been expanded to include the SIT room, which will give our students a ready access to the collective resources of AEES.

**C. Scouts and Guide:**

- i. A three day Scout and Guide Annual Training Camp , Dwitiya Sopan, was organized at AECS-4, Rbt. from 31-10-2009 to 02-11-2009 for the students of AECS-2, 3 and 4 of Rawatbhata.

d. **Prep Classes:** The prep section has completed its glorious seventh year without compromising with its initial momentum. The current strength is 62 students who are ably managed by two teachers. Master Vedant Yadav of Prep-B secured third position in the All India AEES art competition.

During the session ten CCA and four sports activities were conducted. Every student was awarded a prize for one or the other activity. On the occasion of children’s Day Celebration a beautiful tableau was presented. The programmes staged by the tiny tots during the Annual Day programme drew the highest praise from all quarters.

Various festivals like Ganesh Chaturthy, Dusshera, Deepawali, Christmas, and Holi were celebrated in the school campus with a view to fostering communal harmony and fraternity.

A total of 561 students appeared in the annual examination 2010. Eighty students have secured Excellent Grade in all the four subjects. Overall Excellent Index is 92.8. Class II-C turned out to be the best class as no student was placed under Fair and CDB grade in this class.

f. **Talent Nurture Programme:** Of all the charitable ventures initiated by AEES, TNP is certainly the most effective. It has come as a godsend for the many poor children in and round Rawatbhata. In the session 2009-2010 forty-four children were enrolled in the school. Good education would have remained a dream for these children without this scheme. This programme is aimed at nurturing the talents of children with tribal and rural background. They are

provided with free text books, allied study material, clothing, medical facilities and a monthly scholarship of Rs.300/- for boys and Rs. 400/- for girls through bank account.

Five students of the first batch of TNP students appeared in class XII board exam 2010. Three students secured more than 60% marks.

The performance of the students in annual examination 2010 was also very encouraging. One of the students, Om Prakash of class IV-D, who scored 'excellent' in all the four subjects in the Annual Examination-2009 conducted by AEES, Mumbai, could well be the flag bearer of the TNP initiative. The staff members of AECS-4, Rbt. contributed generously and presented a bicycle to this little champ to give a fillip to his fighting spirit against all the odds. Priyanka of VI-B, Payal of VII-C and Shubham of VII-D secured position in their respective classes. TNP students are equally excelling in CCA and Sports activities of the school.

- g. **Infrastructure:** Approval has been accorded by the competent authority for the construction of twelve new class rooms so as to accommodate the increasing strength of students in the school. Just after the financial clearance construction work will start.

## **10 Other Achievements:**

- a. **Science and Social Sciences Exhibition:** In the second week of July the school wore a festive look. The classrooms had become a riot of colours and the air was laden with irrepressible excitement. The occasion was the Multi-disciplinary Exhibition, a prelude to the All India AEES Science, Social Science, Maths and Teaching Aids Exhibition which was to be hosted by the school in August but could not be materialized due to Swine Flu. It was the first major event of the calendar.

There were more than 301 exhibits on display, vying with one another in visual appeal and innovativeness. Science exhibits explored solutions to burning issues of the day, such as climatic changes, water management and energy crunch. Social science models stood out for their aesthetic appeal. The numerous mathematics exhibits simplified the abstract concepts lucidly.

A teaching aid prepared by Ms. Deepali Dubey on the medicinal uses of plants caught the eye of every visitor to the exhibition. This exhibit later bagged the highest prize at the national level.

- b. **Hindi Week:** The Hindi Week was celebrated with great flourish and enthusiasm from 14<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> September 2009. Various programmes were held during the week

culminating in an entertaining and informative Kavi Sammelan. The celebration went a long way in promoting pride in and love for the national language.

**c. Environmental Awareness Programme** We conducted various social awareness programmes to inculcate moral values among the students.

As precautionary and preventive measure to thwart the spectre of Swine Flu, we invited Dr. A Ganeshan, Medical Officer, RAPS Hospital on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2009 to address our students and staff members. He discoursed on the spread of Swine Flu, spelt out the symptoms of it and enlightened the students regarding its prevention. Mr. Ganeshan dispelled the apprehensions of the gathering. He answered the FAQs of the audience in an easy-to-understand way. The session was highly beneficial.

**d. Adult Education Programme:** The transition to adulthood is the most crucial period in human development. It's a period of doubt, stress, anxiety and turmoil. In the absence of proper guidance, adolescents tend to become misfits in later life. With this in view, the School invited Dr. Manoj Kumar and Dr. Nidhi Jain of RAPS Hospital to address the students of class VIII and IX on the physical, emotional and social problems of adolescence. The programme was conducted on 9<sup>th</sup> September 2009 in two separate venues for boys and girls.

Both the doctors handled the sessions admirably. The students were also encouraged to raise doubts through chits. Besides the usual doubts, the students wanted tips on how to concentrate better and how to sharpen their memory. The doctors were very professional in their approach to the problems. In their feedback the participants expressed their satisfaction and expressed their desire to have more such interactive sessions.

**e. Reaching Out:** With a view to extending different facilities of our school such as Laboratory, Library, Botanical Garden etc. to the neighbouring schools, we have chalked out an action plan. To start with, class X students of Rajasthan State Secondary School, Rawatbhata were invited to our school on 1<sup>st</sup> October 2009. The students were given the opportunity to use the library equipment under the supervision of lab incharges. The subject teachers and lab attendants of our school meticulously demonstrated and explained various topics to the students. The students were also permitted to use our library.

**f. VIGILANCE AWARENESS WEEK:** The long term solution of corruption is to inculcate a spirit of vigilance in the young students in their impressionable age and make them realize the carcinogenic effect of corruption on good governance. Keeping this in mind the school observed the Vigilance Awareness Week from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> November 2009. The week long campaign began in the morning assembly with a speech by the Vice-Principal, Ms. R Savitha. She explained the terms associated with vigilance in a language



understandable to the young students. As the week progressed, the need for a corruption-free society was driven home through essay, slogan, poster and speech competitions. On 7th November, Shri Arun Khandelwal, the Vigilance Officer of RR Site, addressed the students and gave away the prizes. In his speech, the vigilance officer likened corruption to a worm in the apple, a metaphor that had the desired effect on the young audience.

**g. Science Week Celebration:** Our School celebrated Science Week from 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb. to 26<sup>th</sup> February 2010. The Science Day was celebrated on 26<sup>th</sup> Feb. 2010. The celebration focused on promoting scientific temper, creativity and independence and Environmental awareness. Various programmes were organized for Primary, Secondary and Senior Secondary students to mark the week. Teachers addressed the students on various topics relating to science. Different competitions relating to science were also conducted during the week. 69 students were awarded on 26<sup>th</sup> Feb 2010 who secured positions in various competitions.

**h. Communal Harmony Campaign and Philanthropy**

The secular fabric of the country is under threat from disruptive forces from within and without. With a view to sensitizing the students about the need for fostering communal harmony, national integration and fraternity, the school observed the Communal Harmony Week from 19<sup>th</sup> Nov to 25<sup>th</sup> November 2009. Various activities like speech on Communal Harmony during morning assembly hours, essay and slogan writing contests were organized to mark the week.

A fund was also raised by the students and teachers generously for the cause of the destitute children and Rs. 15.000/- (Rupees Fifteen Thousand) was collected and sent to the National Foundation for Communal Harmony, New Delhi, for the rehabilitation of children rendered orphan or destitute, in caste, communal, ethnic, terrorist or any other kind of violence that fractures social harmony.

In response to the appeal of Zila Sainik Adhikari, Kota, Govt. of Rajasthan a fund was raised by the students and staff members for the cause of the martyrs and injured soldiers.
